Key news is the notification for our club AGM


This is to be held on WEDNESDAY Dec 6th at 7:30pm at the Lever Club.

Kit Review - BMJR Spacewalker 42" span by Gray Hawke

Kit is made in America so all measurements are in good old-fashioned inches. Plan is on 2 sheets, and highly detailed, providing a good deal of scale detail. Photo illustrated instruction booklet is included, although some assembly steps need a good amount of brain work before you start gluing bits together.

Parts are generally well laser cut and fit together well. Full hardware set is provided in the kit, including some nifty little "EZ fittings" for connecting pushrods to servo arms and control horns. Profile prints for the iconic "sunray" patterns are given on the plan, but I'm yet to work out the best way to use these to create the covering film shapes I'll need.

Construction is all wood – including cowl and wheel pants – so there is quite a bit of lamination to do (each wheel spat comprises 14 separate pieces, for example).

The only significant issues I've encountered have been with the undercarriage; I was very careful to create the 2 wire u/c legs exactly as per the plan. But when assembled, they don't sit at the correct angle relative to the fuselage, and the triangular covers don't fit at all. Luckily, I discovered that rotating the u/c assembly through 180 degrees so the "front" is now the back produces a much better profile. I had to redo the u/c leg covers from scratch. Also, the axles were too short to reach the fixing collet inside the wheel spats, so a further 4 bits of wood were required to reduce the internal width of the wheel openings.

All in all, this is a satisfying build – not for beginners, but good value if you want to put some time and effort into making your own little Spacewalker.





And a couple of my "Work in progress":









4 channel r/c using 4x 9g servos; electric power (I'm using an Air 2210 150 watt motor, 20amp ESC and 3s 800Mah Lipo battery). At the time of writing, I've completed 75% of the build – all except the wings, but no covering yet.
